
NOVA SCOTIA OVERVIEW



- Facility Opened on 2009.
- Located in Elmsdale Industrial park.
- Freestanding building, 27,000 sq. ft.
- Generates approximately \$700,000 of economic expenditures in Nova Scotia.
- Employs twenty one (21) full time employees.
- 12,200,000 kgs of E-waste diverted since 2013.
- 95% of the e-waste comes from EPRA.
- Capacity is unlimited but labour dependent.

- Logistics and transportation
 - High cost to transport goods to Eastern Canada.
 - Unreliable service.
- Labour
 - Shortage of labour.
- Feedstock
 - Revenues are weight based.
 - Weights are declining.
 - # of units is growing.

- Expand recycling to include small appliances and other electronics such as toys and commercial equipment.
