• Preferred Environment recycling paint in NB.

 Addition of paint collected through the Nova Scotia recycling program a larger facility was opened in Springhill NS

 Partnership with Societe Laurentide created Laurentide ReSource Atlantic.





...to now

• Facilities are now in Victoriaville Quebec, Richibucto NB, Springhill NS,

 Laurentide sells recycled paint throughout Canada under the national Boomerang label and several private labels.

 Laurentide also has exports to markets in the Cuba, Central America and Africa.
